LEADERSHIP TEAM ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

Operations Director: Key Responsibilities

- Obtain and manage funding for the LBL program as well as manage the finances with the LSUHSC School of Allied Health business office.
- Execute the Positive Household Routines Lessons provided through the Color Me Healthy
 curriculum with the parents and manage the Health Communications Campaign.
- Recruit families to join the program and oversee the execution of all areas of the LBL program.

Volunteer Coordinator: Key Responsibilities

- Recruit volunteers to participate in the LBL program by sending speaking at school-sponsored events (i.e. recruit through a school SGA meeting).
- Direct and manage volunteers with tasks and duties during the execution of the LBL program.
- Input and manage IPSA volunteer hours by maintaining program sign-in sheets and record keeping.

Children's Nutrition and Physical Activity Educator: Key Responsibilities

- Manage the Eat, Play, Grow curriculum provided through the NIH.
- Instruct or recruit a children's nutrition educator to teach the Eat, Play, Grow curriculum to the children.
- Manage the Early Childhood curriculum provided through the OPEN Online Physical Education.
- Instructor or recruit a physical activity educator to teach the Early Childhood curriculum.

Adult Nutrition Educator: Key Responsibilities

- Execute the Cooking Matters and additional curriculum training to volunteers of the LBL program.
- Instruct or recruit a adult nutrition educator to teach the Cooking Matters for Parents curriculum to the parents.
- Instruct or recruit a chef to grocery shop, cook, and clean to prepare for each LBL class with the families.

Students For Sustainability


A club that facilitates the greening of our campus through maintaining it's garden & overseeing student-led projects






