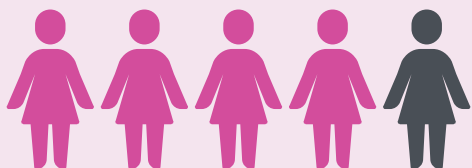

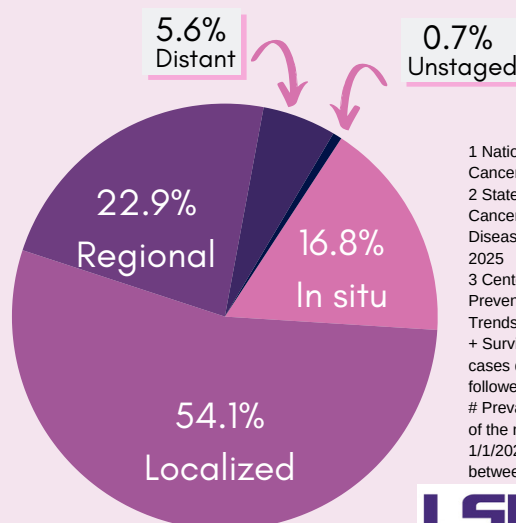

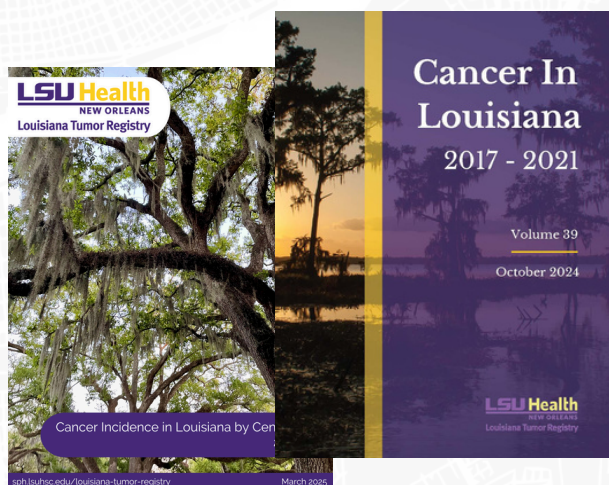
## OUR MISSION
