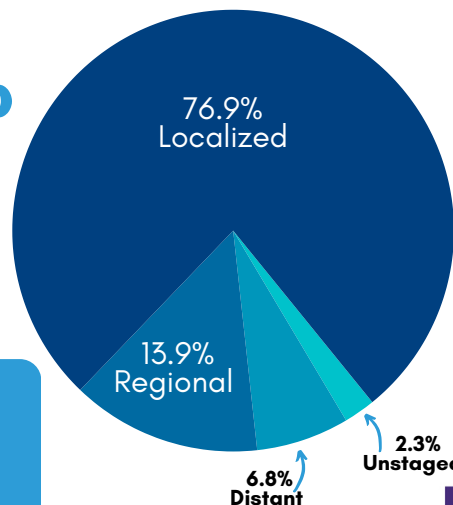


STAGE AT DIAGNOSIS DISTRIBUTION

OUR MISSION



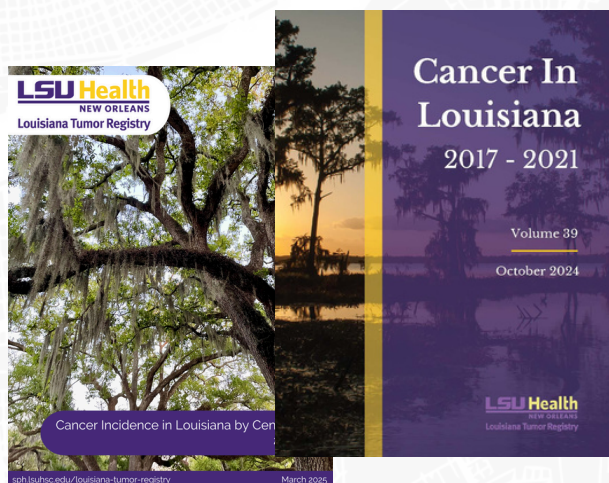
To collect and report complete, high-quality, and timely population-based cancer data in Louisiana to support cancer research, control, and prevention.
