### Major Area of Research Interest

As a practitioner-scholar with a robust background in health promotion and education, my research centers on advancing equitable health outcomes through community-engaged implementation science. Drawing on over a decade of experience in preventive care, health education, and program development, I investigate how social and structural determinants such as neighborhood change, differential treatment, and healthcare system responsiveness shape health outcomes in under-resourced populations. My work is grounded in collaborative, community-based approaches that prioritize the lived experience and translate evidence into sustainable, culturally responsive interventions. I employ mixed methods to explore complex systems and inform policy and practice, with a particular focus on improving maternal health, preventing lifestyle-related diseases, and strengthening public health infrastructure through equitable engagement.
