- The current leniency period previously communicated in [NOT-OD-26-033](#) will end on May 7, 2026, the final AIDS standard receipt date for [Cycle 1](#). Use of the Common Forms for Biographical Sketch, Current and Pending (Other) Support, and NIH Biographical Sketch Supplement will be required for all application due dates and Just-In-Time (JIT), Research Performance Progress Report (RPPR), and Prior Approval submissions on or after May 8, 2026.
- **Funding Opportunity:** LSU Health New Orleans, in partnership with the CCTS and the LSU LCMC Health Cancer Center—is now accepting applications for the **CAPPAL Grant Program**.
